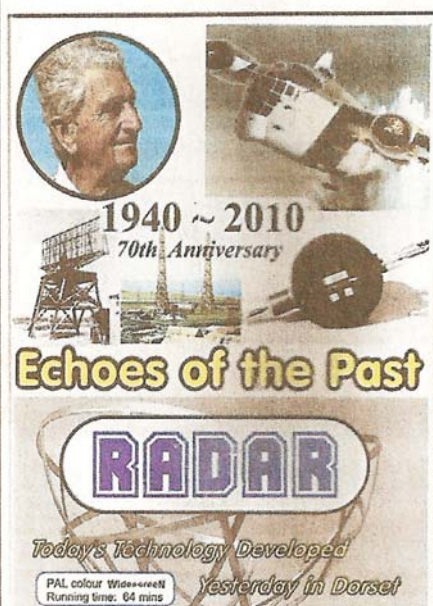

'Echoes Of The Past' Review



An educational film as opposed to an entertainment film, 'Echoes of The Past' is a documentary, narrated by Dr. Bill Penley CB, CBE, a distinguished engineer and a veteran of Worth Matravers in its days as 'Silicon Valley' and Dr. Phil Judkins, a radar historian.

Filmed around the Purbeck area, 'Echoes of The Past' has correlated an enormous amount of information, both historical and technical, regarding the top secret work done at Worth from 1940 to 1942. Information is accompanied by historical photographs of the radar station and related buildings. Local history is included

in the form of anecdotes regarding locals who were involved, or who helped during the two years that Worth saw over 2000 top scientists in residence. Modern technology allows the film makers to superimpose buildings long-lost onto our modern landscape, giving a real impression of how the landscape was changed by radar in the early 1940s. An excellent information film, historically and scientifically important, 'Echoes of The Past' is a good watch for those interested in the technology behind radar, local history buffs and anyone with a sense that we should all know what went into the war effort and the hard work and technological advances that enabled us to win the war. *Nico Johnson*
